Following the tree lighting, Santa will take requests/questions from children via the "Chat" box for about 30 minutes. Let's make the "Grinch" jealous as Santa answers all those questions from our precious kids who are anxiously awaiting Christmas Eve when Santa makes a special visit to their home.

We know that one of the favorite holiday activities in downtown Columbus is Wassail Fest. We also know that it would be difficult this year to enjoy wassail in the same way as the past. However, that "Grinch" is not going to take away the fun of our holidays.
